SCHOOL REPORT CARD

The Wisconsin's Department of Public Instruction released our 2015-2016 school report card, and we are proud to announce that the Charter School has achieved a score of "Meets All Expectations." This is a tremendous accomplishment for our school, staff, and students who have worked exteremly hard to improve our test scores.

Motivated, driven, patient, and kind is not often how one would describe an 8th grade student, but this is exactly how Ms. Garnett, La Causa Charter School's Social Worker, would describe Alma Marcial.

Alma was awarded a Fleck Scholarship from La Causa and was accepted to St. Thomas More High School. She continued to thrive in high school where she exceled in extracurricular activities, and maintained a 3.75 GPA.

After high school, Alma was accepted into multiple colleges, before deciding to attend Alverno College with the President's Scholarship for a four year education.

PARENTAL ENGAGEMENT

Our parents are dedicated to supporting their students, and their involvement in our PTO and training programs show dedication and engagement.

Nineteen parents graduated from either our Padres Comprometidos or CHISPA programs. These programs are held through our partnership with the National Councilof La Raza (NCLR).

Padres Comprometidos is a bilingual parental engagement program designed to foster strong connections between the school and parents, resulting in an increse of students that pursue higher education.

The program trains parents to be effective advocates for their children as they move from middle school into high school, and helps parents play a leading role in preparing their children for college.



La Causa Crisis Nursery & Respite Center



The Crisis Nursery and Respite Center is the only state licensed center of its kind in Wisconsin. We care for up to 12 children each night, and children can stay for up to 72 hours at no cost to the family. We are a resource in the community helping families avoid exposure to traumatic, crisis situations that could leave long-lasting, detrimental effects on a child's emotional, mental and/or physical well-being.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS

WHY OUR GUESTS STAY

In 2016 the top three reasons why children have stayed at the Crisis Nursery are:


- 1) Respite Care 39% of our visits this year were from parents or caregivers needing a short period of relief. We provided the safety-net familes needed to get back on their feet.
- 2) Homelessness 26% of the children we cared for have been homeless. Their families struggle with one of life's most basic needs shelter. We provide the structure children need to feel protected.
- 3) Crisis or domestic violence 15% of the families we served were recovering from traumatic situations. We connected them to community resouces, and provided a safe haven.

CALM FROM THE STORM

Jessica, fleeing from a domestic violence situation out of state, recently moved to Wisconsin to stay with her aunt. She has two young children, both school aged. Jessica and her aunt quickly became overwhelmed by the daunting tasks of enrolling the children in school, connecting to resources, and caring for the youngest child who has special needs. Jessica contacted the Crisis Nursery, and while her children were cared for, she was able to enroll them in school, and secure safe and suitable housing for her family.

Jessica is making steady progress towards stability, and she is appreciative of La Causa for helping in her transition.

La Causa, Inc.'s Early Education and Care Center cares for children age 4 weeks through 3 years old in our child care programs. School-aged children through 12 years old are able to participate in our before and after school program, as well as our summer programs. We offer bilingual classrooms and a creative learning environment.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS

EARLY EDUCATION STANDING

At La Causa's Early Education and Care Center, each child is welcomed as an individual with a unique personality. By tailoring each child's care and education according to his or her development, children form bonds and thrive, giving parents the confidence to pursue their careers and build better lives for their families.

We are proud to say that our Early Education and Care Center was reaccredited by the National Accreditation Commission for early care and education programs, and as a result continue to carry the much coveted "5 star" rating! A great partnership with Next Door also allows us to provide an excellend Early Head Start Program.



EARLY INTERVENTION SCREENINGS

Early intervention screenings are completed with families each year at the Early Education and Care Center. By providing this screening we have now been able to connect five children with birth to three services. These services range from speech therapy and behavior therapy, to services for children on the Autism spectrum or eating challenges.

Without the early intervention screenings, these children may not have received services that are critically important for their development. We are proud to say that these children are doing very well and have showed tremendous improvement in areas in which they were previously behind.

La Causa Social Services Adult programs

La Causa, Inc.'s Social Services Adult Programs provide a vast array of supportive, recovery and strength-based services to adults and families throughout Milwaukee County. We provide services to those who experience mental health, substance abuse, co-occurring mental health and substance use, and individualized life needs.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS

COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNITY SERVICES (CCS)

CCS is a community based program in partnership with Milwaukee County BHD that utilizes a team approach to provide an array of recovery services, treatment, and psychosocial rehabilitation services that assist individuals in utilizing professional, community, and natural support systems to address their unique needs. With the support of a Care Coordinator, individuals create a Recovery Plan tailored to their needs. La Causa is proud to provide these services to support and enrich the lives of members of our community.

WATTS PROGRAM

Henry is a 40-year-old, originally from Puerto Rico, who is currently involved in La Causa's Watts program, in partnership with Milwaukee County DSD. As a youth, Henry sustained a traumatic brain injury and experiences significant difficulty with impulse control, personal boundaries, judgement and planning. Over the years Henry experienced numerous hospitalizations while residing at Mendota mental Health Institue and Milwaukee County Behavioral Health Division.

With supportive services provided by La Causa Henry was moved into an adult family home, where he is continuing to experience a higher quality of life. He has excelled with his studies in reading, math, and writing, and is a positive leader and role-model to his rommates. Henry has also begun leading an exercise group for his fellow residents, and is even teaching the staff how to speak Spanish.

La Causa Social Services Youth Programs



La Causa, Inc.'s Social Services Youth Programs focus on providing an array of services that improve a family's quality of life, such as Crisis Stabilization, Treatment Foster Care, Making Proud Choices, and My Life My Choice. We are proud to be Milwaukee County's largest provider of Wraparound services. Whether services are court ordered or voluntary, our programs focus on a strength-based approach which encourages stability, empowerment, and family development.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS

TREATMENT FOSTER CARE

Treatment foster care is home-based care for children birth to 18 years old who have experienced trauma or abuse. These children may expereince moderate to severe emotional, behavioral, physical or mental challenges. At La Causa, we have a dedicated team of Specialists who provide individual, family centered resources and care through the foster care process.

On October 21, 2016 adoptive parent, Salita Williams, was nominated and selected to receive the 2016 Governor's Outstanding Adoptive Parent Award. through La Causa's Treatment Foster Care program Ms. Williams was able to adopt three siblings, and has maintained a close connection with the children's biological family. On November 22, 2016 Ms. Williams received the award at the State Capitol with her children, her mother and the children's biological family there to support her. La Causa is proud to have connected Ms. Williams with her adoptive children, and congratulates her on her outstanding achievement.

FINDING A FOREVER HOME

In March of 2016 Jeremy was in need of a treatment foster home. He had previously lived with his two sisters in a foster home, that intended on adopting all three children. After some behavioral issues were displayed by Jeremy, the family not longer felt capable of caring for him. At that point he met Mr. Lopez Rodriguez and became a part of his family. Jeremy now has a brother to relate to and socialize with, which has helped improve his mood and self-esteem.

On December 20, 2016 they became a forever family when Mr. Lopez Rodriguez officially adopted Jeremy, surrounded by family and friends. Mr. Lopez adoptive parent, Salita and selected to receive for their wonderful Treatment Foster Care Program, anding Adoptive Parent and specifically, for placing Jeremy in his home. As a Treatment Foster Care the adoption celebrations commenced, the Lopez as able to adopt three Rodriguez family agreed that they had received the best Christmas present of all.




